AS historic numbers flee war and poverty all over the world, Martin Luther King's call for universal economic justice still holds true today.

Martin Luther King Day, presented by Journey to Justice at the V&A Museum of Childhood, will use talks, film and performance to discuss the legacy of the American civil rights leader. It will also discuss the racial, economic and health challenges faced by immigrants to the East End.

Speakers at the event include a writer, educator, poet and artist along with students from Bethnal Green Academy who will demonstrate the impact of migration on children and families and how communities organise to secure their rights.

On Sunday, January 23, a Seafaring London walk takes you from Tower Bridge to Greenwich, through Shad Thames and looking across the water at St Katherine's Dock, Wapping, Limehouse and Millwall.
